Who is eligible?

To enroll in this plan, you must:

- Live in Connecticut
- Work for either BIPI or BIUSA
- Have convenient access to the area served by the plan's network, including ProHealth Physicians medical group

Is this plan right for you?

I'd like my doctors to be more invested in my health.

The Aetna Whole Health CT HSA Plan is an Accountable Care Organization (ACO) plan. This means your care providers are accountable for your total health. Your goals are their goals, from living healthier each day to reaching the best outcome for a health problem or issue.

Keeping myself and my family healthy is important to me.

When you enroll in the plan, you'll have a care team led by your network primary care doctor. They make sure you get preventive care to catch health risks early and avoid future health issues where possible. They also work with you on your particular health concerns and goals.

I want all my doctors to be on the same page with my care.

Members of your care team share medical records and work together to manage your total health. They coordinate care and services with the whole you in mind. They also follow up to see how treatment is working to better manage your health and any health risks.

I want to keep my current Health Savings Account.

If you move from the Aetna HealthFund HSA Plan to the Aetna Whole Health CT Plan, you can keep your existing HSA. When you earn Healthy Actions incentive credits, they will be deposited to your same account.

I want to minimize my health plan payroll contributions.

The Aetna Whole Health CT HSA Plan has the lowest plan rates of all 2020 medical plan options.





How the plan works

You'll choose a primary care physician (PCP) who belongs to the Value Care Alliance & Trinity Health Of New England network.

Your PCP will lead your care team of network nurses, specialists and other providers.

The plan has in-network and out-of-network benefits, so you're free to receive care from any licensed provider.

If you have dependents attending school outside the network's service area, you'll want to be sure they receive preventive care while they're at home. This way, benefits will be paid at the in-network level.

You'll have an HSA you can use to pay for eligible health care expenses. You can use the account for current and future expenses, even those in retirement.
